



The afternoon block was our choosing time. Each space was set up with different activities such as building, crafts, doing plays, playing board games or watching a movie. It was a fun day!
















On Tuesday 28 May 2019 a group of students from Pohutukawa area went to the Hutt City Science STEMM challenge along with around 15 other schools. The group of students from Pohutukawa area were split into two teams named Titipounamu and Piwakawaka.



The STEMM challenge consisted of 5 rounds of quizzes, four being 10 question rounds and one round which was a practical challenge. The 10 round questions consisted of different subjects ranging from history, science to mathematics. In the practical round there were three challenges an elements challenge, a building challenge and a coding challenge. For the elements challenge we were provided with items and had to identify which elements most correspond with the objects. For the building challenge we were marked on how high of a structure we could build with the following materials, string, tape, raw spaghetti, scissors and a marshmallow that went on the top of the structure. In the coding challenge we had to code a bee bot around a virtual race track. After each round the scoreboard was updated with the new points, the total amount of points possible you could score was 50 points. At the end of the challenge everyone was happy and congratulating Titipounamu for coming 2nd overall.

Wellington Museum Trip

On Tuesday 21 May, Rata Area travelled into Wellington to explore our beautiful city. In class, we are learning about Kiwiana and about all the things that are special to our culture and our country. We started the day with a scavenger hunt around the Wellington Waterfront, where we had to locate points on the map and complete the hunt. We saw the mast by Frankitts Park that belonged to the Wahine, as well as Shed 5 which is the oldest building on the waterfront. We then went to Te Papa to find out more about our Maori culture. Finally, the day finished at the Wellington Museum. A highlight of the Wellington Museum was the Attic. In the Attic were lots of different statues and trinkets that are special to Wellington, including taxidermied lions from the Wellington Zoo and the time machine. We also loved the hologram viewing of local Maori Legend Ngake and Whataitai. It was a fantastic day out and a big thank you to all of our parent helpers who helped us out on the day.
