Parking challenges

We have already received a very appreciative response from our Parish Team for your efforts to avoid making use of the Church car park for parking or as a drive through for drop offs and pickups. Many thanks for that.

When looking at other possible options, one that we have not promoted before is the use of the four car parks along the Bloomfield Terrace entrance to the school that have restricted P5 at these busy times. If everyone treated these parks in a similar way to the Wellington Airport drop off and pick up zones then this could be a positive solution to some of our parking challenges, particularly for those students who are comfortable walking into school themselves, or waiting on the inside of the fence until their parent pulls up in the afternoon.

As a safety measure, the teacher on road patrol at the Bloomfield crossing after school, would bring any students still waiting at the fenceline back to the tunnel when they came off patrol.

If this would work for you at pickup time in the afternoon, please talk to your child about where to wait for you (inside the fenceline by the Bloomfield gate). They must be ready to move out of the gate when you pull up (no climbing the tree, no playing in or around the cricket nets etc).

We could begin a trial this week. It would just mean having a conversation with your child about the changes. It will probably involve a bit of trial and error but hopefully we can get something underway that will work well for you.

Damage to school property and equipment

Can I please remind parents that if students are found to cause damage to school property or equipment either through careless or deliberate behaviour, there is an expectation that the school is recompensed for the repair or replacement. Please do not assume that we have insurance that covers this kind of incident.

In cases of deliberate damage, full recovery of costs will be expected. We are fortunate that this is quite a rare event at our school. In cases of careless or foolish behaviour, it may be that a contribution towards costs is more appropriate. The intent is that children learn that their behaviour has consequences and a contribution from their own savings to make amends can be a very powerful lesson. Getting to the bottom of these events can be a time-consuming business and we are very reliant on the honesty of those involved or of any witnesses. When conducting an investigation our expectations are that all students, regardless of gender uphold the values and expectations of behaviour at our school. We appreciate the support of our parent community as you, as first educators, work with your children to develop those important values of honesty and taking responsibility for their own actions.


