There have been debates over the years about whether handwriting has been superseded by word processing. This has been unfortunate as evidence tells us clearly that for the majority of students, handwriting helps to reinforce spelling knowledge, and content knowledge, much more

than typing does. The teaching of these skills form an important part of our writing programmes. Handwriting is a top priority, particularly in the early years of school or when teaching our older students who have

difficulties with their letter formation.

Handwriting and spelling also have significant benefits for reading development. I'll be sharing our school-wide spelling data at next week's Board meeting for discussion.

The disciples then went out and spread the Good News around the world. Just like those disciples so long ago, we also have the Holy Spirit living within us, giving us that same courage and strength to


