DEAR PARENTS AND CAREGIVERS

Kia ora koutou katoa

We trust that you are keeping warm and well, and are all geared up for this exciting and busy new term! To our new families, we extend a warm welcome to our school community. We also welcome Miss Lucy Bambry to our teaching team. Lucy has been working in our school supporting students with their school transition and is a trained teacher who has previously worked as an Early Childhood Teacher. She is pursuing her interest in the early years of education and as of this term, will be working in Room 5, supporting the classroom teaching of literacy and numeracy.

CURRICULUM AND INQUIRY

We will continue this term with our overarching concept of 'Exploration'. A reminder that the 'Big Ideas' we have been relating our learning to this year are:

- Exploration is learning
- Exploration is when I wonder
- Exploration opens my eyes

Religious Education

Our focus for RE this term will be around Holy people and objects. We will be visiting the church to identify what makes something Holy and what it makes us feel. We will grow in an understanding that the Church is a Catholic community of God's family in which we are welcomed.

Along with this, we will be looking at the assumption of Mary and celebrating the way in which Mary responded to God with love and grace. The children will also learn the Hail Mary prayer and understand that it is a great **Taonga** that belongs to Catholic people. We will explore Faith as a whole-life experience, developing our understanding that it isn't just something we know in our minds, or feel in our hearts.

Social Sciences

This term we will have a closer look at the NZ Histories curriculum. Through our learning we will begin to understand that we are connected to other people in NZ and around the world. We will look at the history of voyaging, discovery and trade. We will explore how migration has influenced and shaped New Zealand over time and how it has affected the ideas, technology and values of people in Aotearoa.
