# 2025

2025 promises to be an exciting year of learning for our year 7 & 8 students.

Our area has a strong focus on building our students ability to have a go at new things and grow their communication and collaboration skills, while working with a variety of people. It is always great to see students grow in confidence and self belief as they become more adventurous and independent.

We particularly look forward to tamariki being able to take full advantage of leadership opportunities as senior students in our school.

## **Universal Concept**

The Universal Concept across Ss Peter & Paul School for 2025 is **PATTERNS**. This concept will be threaded through our learning across curriculum areas and throughout the year.

PATTERNS and the use of the Depth & Complexity thinking tools are combined so that students can enhance and extend their learning this year.

## Term 1 Curriculum

#### **Religious Education**

This term, we're learning about Te Rongopai - Good News. We will focus on the history, significance, and purpose of the Bible. We will reflect on the Good News and explore the ways in which the Holy Spirit inspires us.



#### **Mathematics**

This year we are looking forward to enhancing our maths programme with the new 'Maths No Problem' resource. Students will be provided with workbooks to support their learning and understanding.

We will begin the term with a focus on place value and rounding, followed by multiplication and division.



#### Writing

We begin our writing in 2025 with a look at poetry, recounts and letter writing. In years 7 & 8, there is a focus on students becoming more aware of their audience and more effective when following the writing process. Students develop strong reflective skills and use editing to enhance the quality of their written work.

#### Reading

In Rata area we develop our reading skills through mixture of reading by with and to our students. We encourage a love of students in our students and recommend some time spent at home enjoying books each day. Through language based activities we are also learning about punctuation and grammar.

#### **Physical Education**

Students change into PE gear Monday to Thursday for either morning fitness sessions or PE lessons. This term students will experience team building games, netball, volleyball and danish rounders. During these lessons we will be working on our teamwork and ball skills, specifically passing, throwing and catching.



#### **Technology**

Our year 7 & 8 students are enjoying technology learning at Avalon Intermediate school. We travel to Avalon Intermediate by bus every Friday for the duration of the year. Students experience food, fabric, visual art, hard materials and woodwork technology classes.



#### **New Zealand History**

We will be exploring the Treaty of Waitangi and the impact it has had on New Zealand over time. Along with this we will unpack the impact colonialism has had on Aotearoa. Students will be encouraged to think critically and consider the perspectives of many different people in our country.

#### **Sharing of Learning**

Throughout the year illustrations of your child's classwork and learning will be shared. These include some assessment by both teacher and student. Our aim is to provide an authentic context and audience for students and give parents a window into their child's progress and needs.

#### **Learning Conferences**

At the end of terms 1, 2 & 3 whanau will be invited to book and attend learning conferences with their child and their child's teacher. These are an opportunity to share assessment results, share learning illustrations and discuss your child's interests, goals and learning. We look forward to seeing you all there!

### **Behaviour Management**

At Ss Peter & Paul School we have an effective and consistent behaviour management plan. We believe in a restorative practice approach. This encourages students to explore any issues that may arise at school in the classroom or playground, take responsibility for their own actions and then repair any harm. We look to empower students with strategies and tools to help them moving forward.

 We ask that you please encourage your child to let their classroom teacher or a duty teacher know if they have any issues in the class or playground. This enables us to help out in a timely manner.

## Social Media

- In recent years this has been a consistent trap for some of our students causing social and self esteem issues.
- Young people under the age of 13 are not permitted to be on many social media platforms. Those who are, often need support with managing social media.
- Children do not always understand the long term implications and the permanence of photos, videos and messages that are on the internet.
- Issues/conflicts that arise from social media activity occur outside of school hours on private social media accounts. Responsibility for online behaviours lies with students and their parents. When the school has to intervene, it takes many hours or days of staff time, and, it pulls us away from our core job of teaching.
